

HB2604* An Act relating to agriculture; amending 27A O.S. 2001, Section 1-3-103, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 100, O.S.L. 2004, and as renumbered by Section 4, Chapter 100, O.S.L. 2004 (2 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 2-18.2), which relates to National Pollution Discharge Elimination System; modifying duty of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry; amending 2 O.S. 2001, Section 3-85, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 64, O.S.L. 2005 (2 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 3-85), which relates to regulation of pesticides; amending 2 O.S. 2001, Section 8-41.16, which relates to the Oklahoma Commercial Feed Law; amending 2 O.S. 2001, Section 8-77.15, which relates to the Oklahoma Fertilizer Act; modifying the environmental jurisdiction of the Department of Environmental Quality; and providing an effective date.

HB2810* An Act relating to energy; creating the Oklahoma Refinery Revitalization Act; stating purpose of the act; providing definitions; requiring the Governor to request the Environmental Protection Agency to negotiate with the Department of Environmental Quality for a Refinery Permitting Cooperative Agreement (RPCA); directing the Executive Director to designate staff for certain purposes; authorizing the Executive Director and certain Indian tribes to sign the RPCA; stipulating that certain actions occur upon signing the RPCA; authorizing the Executive Director to accept consolidated applications and enter into certain memoranda of agreements; authorizing the Executive Director to request financial, technical, legal, and other assistance from the federal government for certain purposes; requiring the RPCA to designate each state and federal agency with certain expertise; designating the Department of Environmental Quality as the lead agency for certain purposes; directing the Executive Director to coordinate all state, federal, tribal, and local authorizations and reviews; directing the Executive Director to establish a schedule and preapplication process for refinery facility applications; requiring draft permits to be completed within certain time period; allowing applicant to stop process; allowing an applicant to pursue certain remedies if schedule is not met; stipulating the RPCA address the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 compliance actions; providing for the preparation of a single environmental impact statement; requiring state agencies to cooperate with the Department in preparing an environmental impact statement; requiring the Department to maintain a consolidated record of administrative decisions; making the record the exclusive record for state administrative proceedings; providing for the appeal of state agency decisions or actions to a certain panel; establishing panel; establishing guidelines for the panel; providing for judicial appeal; providing for application of environmental laws and rules; directing the Corporation Commission to cooperate with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission on authorizations for crude oil or refined petroleum product pipeline facilities; authorizing the Commission to establish a schedule for state pipeline authorizations; listing certain guidelines; providing for judicial appeal; directing the Commission to issue an order authorizing certain actions relating to the pipeline facility; authorizing the holder of a Commission order to acquire property through eminent domain in certain circumstances; allowing a

taxpayer to treat certain costs of a qualified refinery property as a nonchargeable expense to a capital account; limiting deduction to certain year; providing for how election is taken; prohibiting revocation of election; defining terms; providing for compliance with provisions if total output of an existing qualified refinery is increased by a certain percentage; prohibiting deduction for certain types of refinery property; allowing allocation of the deduction to certain qualified persons; establishing guidelines for allocating the deduction; requiring taxpayers to file a certain report in order to claim the deduction; limiting application of law to certain qualified refinery properties; allowing certain refiners to take a deduction for certain sulfur regulation compliance costs; providing for calculation of allocation amount; providing filing criteria for election; requiring certain written notice for allocations to owners; limiting application of law to certain refinery properties; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB1366* An Act relating to environment and natural resources; amending 17 O.S. 2001, Section 354, as last amended by Section 21, Chapter 435, O.S.L. 2005 (17 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 354), which relates to an assessment on motor fuel, diesel fuel, and blending materials; modifying distribution of assessment; amending 27A O.S. 2001, Section 2-7-125, which relates to regulation of hazardous waste; correcting statutory language; removing requirement for certain disposal plan number on certain manifests; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB1460* An Act relating to environment and natural resources and property; creating the Uniform Environmental Covenants Act; providing short title; providing scope; defining terms; providing nature of rights and subordination of interests; providing mandatory contents of environmental covenants; providing for discretionary contents of environmental covenants; providing for validity and enforceability of covenant; providing for validity of certain other instruments; providing for validity and enforceability of interest enforceable by other law of this state; providing effect of other laws and instruments prohibiting or restricting use of real property; requiring notice and providing procedure therefor; requiring recording of environmental covenants and amendments or termination of environmental covenants; providing duration of environmental covenants; providing for termination under doctrine of changed circumstances; providing that environmental covenants may not be extinguished, limited, or impaired by certain actions or by application of certain doctrines or laws; providing for amendment or termination by consent; providing for enforcement of environmental covenants; clarifying authority of regulatory agencies; clarifying personal responsibility for environmental remediation; promoting

uniformity of law; providing relationship to electronic signatures in Global and National Commerce Act; repealing 27A O.S. 2001, Section 2-5-118, which relates to the Oklahoma Clean Air Act; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB1463* An Act relating to environment and natural resources; amending Section 2, Chapter 371, O.S.L. 2004 (10 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 7602), which relates to the Lead-Impacted Communities Relocation Act; modifying legislative findings; expanding purpose of act; Section 3, Chapter 371, O.S.L. 2004 (10 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 7603), which relates to relocation assistance; authorizing grants to certain persons for relocation due to subsidence risk; stating eligibility; limiting payments to one per household; modifying uses of certain funds; removing certain application assistance deadline; stating funds shall be expended on certain priority basis; amending Section 4, Chapter 371, O.S.L. 2004 (10 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 7604), which relates to enforcement of certain restrictions; modifying restrictions on certain reoccupation; amending Section 5, Chapter 371, O.S.L. 2004 (10 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 7605), which relates to causes of action; prohibiting certain claims or right of action; prohibiting judicial review of certain determinations; terminating the Ottawa Reclamation Authority upon certain date; providing for transfer of certain assets and records; repealing 45 O.S. 2001, Section 801, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 17, O.S.L. 2003, Sections 802, 803, 804, 805, 806, 807, 808, 809, 810, 811, 812, 813, 814, and 815 (45 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 801), which relate to the Ottawa Reclamation Authority; providing for codification; providing for recodification; and declaring an emergency.

SB1557* An Act relating to environment and natural resources; amending 27A O.S. 2001, Section 2-10-802, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 400, O.S.L. 2005 (27A O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 2-10-802), which relates to solid waste disposal sites; removing obsolete language; authorizing disposal site owners or operators to retain certain fee for recoupment of capital investment for purchase of certain wheel wash system; stating procedures; stating limit; authorizing Board of Environmental Quality to promulgate rules; providing effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB1965* An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 27A O.S. 2001, Section 2-11-403, as last

amended by Section 2, Chapter 230, O.S.L. 2005, and as renumbered by Section 9, Chapter 230, O.S.L. 2005 (27A O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 2-11-401.2), which relates to the Oklahoma Waste Tire Recycling Act; exempting registered all-terrain vehicles and off-road motorcycles from certain fees; deleting obsolete language; amending 47 O.S. 2001, Sections 1102, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 284, O.S.L. 2005, 1105, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 284, O.S.L. 2005, 1109, as last amended by Section 64, Chapter 1, O.S.L. 2005, 1118, 1142 and 1144 (47 O.S. Supp. 2005, Sections 1102, 1105 and 1109), which relate to the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act; modifying scope of certain definition; defining term; exempting the Tax Commission as a party from certain lawsuits; authorizing Tax Commission to accept certain documents to issue certain title; clarifying informational search and retrieval fee provisions; authorizing Tax Commission to promulgate rules relating to exemption from retrieval fee; exempting the Tax Commission as a party from certain lawsuits; requiring court to issue order of dismissal; providing for the collection of certain fee by motor license agents; authorizing Tax Commission to accept certain payment by debit card; amending 68 O.S. 2001, Section 2103, as last amended by Section 10, Chapter 284, O.S.L. 2005 (68 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 2103), which relates to vehicle excise tax; providing minimum excise tax assessment for all-terrain vehicles and off-road motorcycles; updating statutory reference; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
