### CHAPTER I.—CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS

§ 1. Repealed. Laws 1967, c. 23, § 3. Eff.  
March 6, 1967.

Referendum Petition No. 18 (State Question No. 437) submitted to the People the question whether House Bill No. 669 should be approved. House Bill No. 669

(Laws 1965, c. 511) enacted provisions allocated to section 2 dividing the State into six Congressional Districts and repealed section 1 of this title. The Question was submitted to the People on Nov. 8, 1966. The Governor on Nov. 17, 1966 filed his Proclamation that House Bill No. 669 had been disapproved.

Accordingly, section 1 of this title was not repealed by Laws 1965, c. 511, § 3, and the new provision of section 2 of this title as enacted by Laws 1965, c. 511, § 1, did not take effect.

### § 2. Number—Counties composing.

Referendum Petition No. 18 (State Question No. 437) submitted to the People the question whether House Bill No. 669 should be approved. House Bill No. 669 (Laws 1965, c. 511) enacted provisions allocated to section 2 dividing the State into six Congressional Districts and repealed section 1 of this title. The Question was submitted to the People on Nov. 8, 1966. The Governor on Nov. 17, 1966 filed his Proclamation that House Bill No. 669 had been disapproved.

Accordingly, section 1 of this title was not repealed by Laws 1965, c. 511, § 3, and the new provisions of section 2 of this title as enacted by Laws 1965, c. 511, § 1, did not take effect.

§ 3. Number of districts—Counties composing.—The State of Oklahoma is hereby divided into six (6) Congressional Districts, each of which shall be composed of the counties named, and the districts shall be numbered from one (1) to six (6), inclusive, and each district shall be composed of the counties with a population according to the Federal Decennial Census of 1960, as follows:

## Laws 1967, c. 23, § 1.

Emergency. **Effective March 6, 1967.**

Laws 1967, c. 23, § 2 provides as follows:

"This act shall not affect the operation of any board, commission, or other entity whose membership is based upon congressional districts which have heretofore been created by law."

## Title of Act:

An Act relating to Congressional Districts; fixing boundaries and dividing the State into six Congressional Districts; providing that this Act shall not affect the operation of any board, commission, or other entity whose membership is based upon Congressional Districts which have heretofore been created by law; repealing 14 O.S.1961, § 1; and declaring an emergency. be made in accordance with the terms of the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution and laws of Oklahoma, the Senate shall be composed of forty-eight (48) members elected from the districts hereinafter described. Senators elected from even-numbered districts in November, 1964, shall hold office until the fifteenth day following the general election in November, 1966, and until their successors are duly qualified, and Senators elected from odd-numbered districts in November, 1964, shall hold office until the fifteenth day following the general election in November, 1968, and until their successors are duly qualified. Senators elected in the general election in 1966 and in subsequent general elections shall hold office for a period of four (4) years and until their successors are duly qualified. All filings of notification and declaration and election to any of such offices shall designate the number of the office to which said filings of notification and declaration and election are intended to apply. In the event of a discrepancy in the description of a district, the State Election Board shall proceed in accordance with the obvious intent hereof and shall report said discrepancy to the next session of the Legislature.
